ROUND DANCING IN THE MARITIMES

submitted by John & Valerie Pinks

Although its roots are in the square dance movement, Round Dancing takes place in a number of clubs throughout the Maritimes which are dedicated to this dance form. The easy level two-step and waltz routines such as "Cab Driver" and "Tips of My Fingers" which have been enjoyed for years between square dance tips have, over time, grown into a well-structured, integral, yet distinct part of the Western Dance activity. Round dance cuers use terminology and instruction methods which are dictated by Roundalab, the round dance equivalent of Callerlab, to quide their dancers through a wide variety of dance rhythms. Starting with two-step and waltz, dancers may progress over the years from phase 2 through phase 6 to include all of the rhythms used in ballroom and social dancing. These include: foxtrot, tango, jive, rumba, cha cha, bolero, mambo, samba, paso doble, quickstep, west coast swing, and slow two-step. Although the terminology used in the higher level dancing is often identical to that used in ballroom dancing, the ballroom emphasis on competition is replaced in round dancing by a "Just for Fun" concept.

This year's Roundalab Convention, to be held on June 22 to 25 in Orlando, Florida, will be attended by John & Valerie Pinks and Beth & John Dickinson who all hope to return with improved leadership skills and renewed enthusiasm.
