Sight Resolving When All Partners Are Paired

Many methods of sight resolution begin by requiring the caller to normalize the formation and to pair at least one couple. Once these two goals have been completed the probability is 50% that all couples will be paired. Theoretically the final resolution should be easy because the only remaining issue to deal with is making sure the dancers are In Sequence. In actuality, many callers find it difficult to determine the sequence and need other clues to help. Here are some suggestions for possible ways to complete the resolution.

1) **From Normal Facing Lines:** Look for adjacent corners either beside each other in the center of the line or around one end. If corners are adjacent then they are all In Sequence.

a) Use a memorized Zero Line Get-Out such as:

Basic:	All 8 Circle Left, Allemande Left
Basic:	Two Ladies Chain, Ladies Chain back into a Promenade
Basic:	Flutterwheel (or Reverse) and Sweep 1/4, Pass Thru, Allemande Left
Basic:	Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Chain Down the Line into Promenade
Basic:	Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Double Pass Thru,
	First Couple Go Left, Next Follow into a Promenade
Basic:	Touch 1/4, Column Circulate, Boys Run, Left Allemande
Mainstream	 Dixie Style to a Wave, Balance, Left Swing Thru, Girls Run, Promenade Pass the Ocean, Ladies Trade, Recycle, Pass Thru, Left Allemande Slide Thru, Square Thru Three, Left Allemande
Plus: Plus:	Touch 1/4 and Roll, Slide Thru (carefully), Left Allemande Touch 1/4, Coordinate, Girls Run, Left Allemande

b) If the corners are not adjacent then the dancers are Out Of Sequence. Use Right and Left Thru or Pass Thru and Bend the Line to change the sequence and then use a Zero Line Get-Out. Or use a Get-Out for Normal Facing Lines with All Paired and Out Of Sequence such as:

Basic:	Flutterwheel, Reverse Flutterwheel into a Promenade
Basic:	Pass the Ocean, Boys Run, Promenade
Basic:	Star Thru, Pass Thru, Allemande Left
Mainstream:	Dixie Style to a Wave, Boys Trade, Girls Circulate, Left Allemande Pass Thru, Ends Fold, Right and Left Grand Slide Thru, Box the Gnat, Right and Left Grand
Plus:	Load the Boat, Pass Thru, Left Allemande
Plus:	Pass Thru, Partner Trade and Roll, Right and Left Grand

2) From Normal Parallel Two-Faced Lines (either left or right): Look for your two noted corners. One is in front of the other. If the one in front is on the inside of the formation then the dancers are In Sequence.

a) If they are In Sequence all that remains to be done is to make sure they are facing Promenade direction. Call *California Twirl* if necessary to turn couples around to face counterclockwise. Then call *Promenade*.

b) If they are Out of Sequence call *Couples Trade* to put them In Sequence. Go to part (a).

3) **From Parallel Right-Hand Waves:** If the two noted gents (or ladies) are an equal distance from their own home, then they are In Sequence. (For example, both might need to half circulate to be in their home quadrant.) Once the sequence is known, use a memorized Get-Out.

- a) Right-Hand Waves, In Sequence, Boys on the End: Basic: Boys Run, Promenade Mainstream: Scoot Back, Right and Left Grand Plus: Single Hinge, Follow Your Neighbor, Extend, Left Allemande
- b) Right-Hand Wave, In Sequence, Girls on the End:
 Basic: Girls U Turn Back, Promenade
 Mainstream: Turn Thru, Left Allemande
 Plus: Single Hinge and Roll, Pass Thru, Left Allemande
- c) Right-Hand Wave, Out Of Sequence, Boys on the End: Basic: Girls Trade, Swing Thru, Girls U Turn Back, Promenade Mainstream: Recycle, Veer Left, California Twirl, Promenade Plus: Explode the Wave, Partner Trade and Roll, Right and Left Grand
- d) Right-Hand Wave, Out Of Sequence, Girls on the End: Basic: Boys Trade, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Promenade Mainstream: Boys Run, Tag the Line, Face Left, Promenade Plus: Single Hinge and Roll, Square Thru 3, Left Allemande

CALLERLAB Update

This is the year for the triennial review of the program lists. All of the reviews except Challenge have now been completed. The only change is to the Advanced Program where the Any Hand Concept will be moved from the preface onto the list. This was done so that it will not be neglected by those teaching Advanced dancers.

The proposed Mainstream Teaching Order which has been under discussion and trial for several years has finally been officially approved. A copy is attached to this document.

Teaching Veer Left and Veer Right in the New Order

Veer Left and Veer Right have been moved from teaching number 48 to number 19. The preceding calls are Ladies Chain, and Lead Right. As a consequence callers will need to rethink the patter and singers used when teaching this move. This change makes to easier to create Two-Faced Lines. Here are some patter suggestions and corresponding singing call figures.
