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Oil Pipeline on McNabs Island

One of the items unearthed on McNabs Island by Hurricane Juan is an 800 foot long pipe containing heavy oil. The pipe now lies exposed on Maugers Beach and leads from the old oil pump house and storage site to Garrison Pier. It is believed that the pipe was used during WW II to carry oil from the pier to up to military establishments on McNabs Island that were active during the war years. No one knows how long the pipe really is and no one knows when the Department of Natural Resources will have the pipe removed and the site cleanedup. In the interim, the pipe has been plugged to prevent the oil from oozing onto the beach.

Park Advisory Committee Update

At a McNabs and Lawlor Islands Park Advisory Committee meeting in January, members of the committee were informed that the Canadian Food and Inspection Agency (CFIA) has advised the Department of Natural Resources that spruce trees damaged by Hurricane Juan must be removed from the island. CFIA has long believed that the European Brown Spruce Longhorn Beetle is present on McNabs Island and must be eradicated. The Department of Natural Resources has determined that about 70% of the island is a high risk zone, which means the brown spruce beetle has been sighted in the area and there is alsosignificant hurricane damage. The island will be severely impacted by this decision. Forestry operations are expected to begin this spring. All spruce trees larger than 10cm in diameter damaged by the hurricane and within the high risk zone will be removed. Unlike Point Pleasant Park where logs were transported to a sawmill for processing, the damaged trees on McNabs and Lawlor Islands will be cut and chipped on site.

Guide for School Groups

One of the mandates of the Friends of McNabs Island Society is to promote the Island as an outdoor classroom. One way this is done is with a marvelous, hands-on kit available to teachers through the Museum of Natural History. This kit can be used to complement the language arts, social studies and science programs in the elementary school curriculum. We would recommend this kit to any teacher who is planning to take their class to McNabs. Try to use it a few weeks prior to your trip to the island.

We have also conducted teacher workshops on the island as part of teacher inservicing. Some teachers have expressed an interest in taking their students to the island but are not familiar with the trail system or the history. Carolyn Mont, a retired school teacher and long time member of the Friends of McNabs Island Society, is available to lead tours and class trips on the island.

Teachers must make their own arrangements to get to the island but, if available, Carolyn will accompany them and their class. **Space is limited**. If you are interested, please call Carolyn at 477-0187 as soon as possible.

If you call the NS Visitor Information Centre at the Halifax International Airport (873-1223 or 873-1224) they have current information about how to get to McNabs. The airport centre is open 7 days a week (even on Christmas) from 9am to 9pm and has brochures and maps of the island. You can also look in the yellow pages under Boats/Charters, Rentals.
