A new wharf is expected to cost \$275,000. The Department of Natural Resources is looking for partners to help finance the construction and maintenance of the new wharf.

PETER MCNAB FAMILY TREE

Several years ago, Nancy Ross (a McNab descendant) and her husband Donald volunteered their time working on a genealogical chart of the Peter McNab family. They then made this material available to the Friends of McNabs Island Society.

Recently, Carolyn Gallagher, a board member of the Friends, input the Ross' work into Family Tree Marker Program of Ancestry.com. She also spent time at the Archives of Nova Scotia where she was able to get a bit more information to add to this family tree.

Some changes were made to more accurately report names and dates. However, as original resources were not necessarily consulted, most dates and names entered into the program remained unchanged. A number of dates are not fully explained. For example, some dates were shown with (b) after them. It was assumed that (b) meant birth date but, in fact, it referred to the baptismal date. The question remains...was this individual baptized at birth or did a significant amount of time lapse between birth and baptism?

Like all family trees, the McNab Family Tree is a work in progress. Hopefully, it will continue to develop in both size and accuracy. A display of the Family Tree will be available for viewing at the Annual General Meeting.
